Dave Brockman is the Deputy Chief Operating

Officer of the Richland office of Kurion, Inc's Modular Vitrifiction System Test Facility. Kurion is in Richland to demonstrate their vitrification technologies in pursuit of a contract to vitrify the nuclear waste being cleaned up at Hanford.

The company has two systems in their treatment arsenal. Their Modular Vitrification System (MVS) is a single cycle, inductively heated, melt-in-the-final-container system. This system has the potential



to offer cost, schedule, and safety advantages over competing technologies due to its ease of scalability, waste insensitivity, ability to receive either dry solids for slurry feed, absence of molten glass pouring, viscosity independence, and wider range of process temperatures. The GeoMelt system uses electric current to convert waste into a stable glass and crystalline product. The conversion can be done in metal containers, typically metal drums or it can be done on site in the ground where the contamination is located.

Dave told us that Kurion has been very successful working in Japan to help them deal with the liquid waste from their nuclear disaster. He feels that the experience the company gained in Japan makes them a strong contender for a contract at Hanford. The company has moved their test facilities to Richland and envision more expansion and employment in the future should they get the contract they are seeking.

This was a very interesting program and if you want to learn more I encourage you to Google Kurion and read up on the technology and its application to Hanford. That's what I did to get what little info I have given you here.
