#### **Announcements**

We learned that he once delivered a baby, was the first Marine to head up a Naval Command, was jailed as a young man in Richland, but never turned down a NASA mission! She then invited General Mattis forward for his induction as an Honorary Rotarian. He grew up in Richland and was a graduate of Central Washington University, before serving 42 years in the Marine Corps in leadership positions,



including Supreme Commander of NATO and heading up the Central Command. Linda stated that Honorary membership is the highest honor a club can bestow, and it was fitting to give this to General Mattis, whose service embodies Rotary values. Linda then presented him with his Rotary pin, plus his Paul Harris fellowship, bringing him into a group of 150,000 Rotarians whose contributions have further strengthened the Foundation.



Bill Stahl came from the Kadlec Foundation, to thank Rotarians for their support of Kids Dig Rigz event in May. \$50,000 was raised for pediatric services, and many children and families enjoyed a day with the big rigs.

# Judge Jim Bauer

Jim asked all those who didn't have their pins to make a donation. He then asked for brags or kudos. Madeleine Brown said she had attended a memorial service at a Baptist church for the victims of the Charleston shooting, and was different from anything she'd experienced in her Quaker background. Bill Stahl donated in honor of his children and grandchildren. Leslie said her sister had visited from Arizona this past weekend, and she had a great time attending the Weiner Dog Races in Ellensburg. Jim then quizzed the club on facts from the latest Rotarian magazine: The year the Marine Corps was founded (1775), which Uniform Service has the oldest song (Marine Corp Hymn), who is the new Rotary International President (Ravi Ravindran), his motto for the year ("Be a Gift to the World"), the number of cases of wild polio last year (359), the cost of one dose of oral polio vaccine (10 cents), and the width of the golf cup hole (4.5"). Larry Jecha announced that Darryl Francis donated his \$10.00 prize to the Foundation.

# **Program**

Gordon Bopp introduced Colleen Fox, Director of Development for the Ronald McDonald House of Spokane, which serves families from across Eastern Washington, Northern Idaho and Montana.

Colleen is a graduate of Gonzaga University, and served as a volunteer at the Ronald McDonald House, before joining its staff, and then was promoted to her current position in 2014. Colleen reviewed some statistics on the House and its services, which serves the families of children in a

medical crisis. In 2014 60 families stayed at the house, for an average length of stay of 44 days. 50% of the families are there due to premature babies, 30% for children in cancer treatment, and 20% for trauma or other medical medical illnesses. The House has a room inside Sacred Heart Children's Hospital, which has a play area, as well as rest area in which parents can relax, as well as the Ronald McDonald Mobile Unit, which is a van that provides medical, dental and vision services to children in the Yakima Valley. This van sees about 2000 children and does 8000 visits per year.

The Ronald McDonald House opened in 1987, primarily due to a family who lost their child to cancer after two years, and wanted to give families a place to stay and have a support network during this difficult period, when your child is very ill.



The house was expanded in 2000 to 22 rooms, but still is often fully booked for extended periods, and unable to accommodate all the demand from families needing a place to stay. Community support has been very important, not just monetary, but groups or individuals may come in to visit and bring a home cooked meal, or the families staying there become a support to each other.


