Chief Justice Jeanne



Congressman Doc Hastings

- Although a budget at all levels of government is mandatory, there is no federal budget this year.

 In addition, we import 85% of our uranium. We need domestic sources.

"Considerable progress has been made in reducing literacy; yet close to one billion people lack the most basic literacy and numeracy skills. Millions more are functionally illiterate, lacking the skills necessary to meet the demands of everyday life.
