Ken decided to do a quiz this week. All questions were about Rotary such as the number of clubs worldwide, 35,000 in 200 countries, the number of members is about 1.2 million and they give about 16 million hours of volunteer service each year. In brags Julie Funfar said she was celebrating her



4-year anniversary with the club. We had two members with extended trips to Ireland, Jim Bauer also went to Holland. He said they attended a Rotary meeting in Holland the talk happened to be about the memorial for a B-17 that crashed there in WWII. Local school kids maintain the grounds.

Program

Julie Funfar was up again to introduce our speaker, Davin Diaz of DrewBoy Creative. Mr. Diaz is with the Mid-Columbia libraries and established DrewBoy in 2015. Drew Boy Creative is named

after Andrew William Diaz, the brother of Davin Diaz. Andrew, sometimes called Drew Boy, passed away at the age of 31 in 2014. His death inspired David to follow his dreams and create an organization dedicated to improving the world through art. It is a non-profit organization.

Mr. Diaz has long been involved in arts in the area, as an artist and on various committees and boards around the area. Prior to starting the Creative, he made a documentary of artist Cameron Mills while he did seven paintings. The paintings were then hung in a gallery with no titles or other information, and viewers were



asked what they would title the work, and what themes they saw. The comments were incorporated in the film. After being put away for a couple of years, Diaz finally showed the work at the Uptown Theater. This paved the way for his efforts to develop DrewBoy Creative, despite many people who said a modern art effort in Tri-cities would never fly. It has been open for about a year and a half, using the Confluent Makerspace gallery and studio 285 Williams Boulevard, across from the Uptown Center.

They have done fifteen exhibitions such as one in January called State of the Union last January that was a pop-up show, that is, artists were invited to come to the show, bring a painting and hang their work wherever they wanted in the gallery. Another show was titled Red, and explored themes of love and loss. A show in May, called 'Invisible' was about mental health. Coming up is a show on Human After All which Madison Rosenbaum talked about. She started doing art to aid in her own healing, and started a project interviewing artists to learn about their struggles and stories. She ended up creating a book as well as an exhibit (Opening July 21st) of 24 stories and images.

Coming in October is a show called Yellow, using the color as a theme in the works. Diaz mentioned local artist Cameron Milton who was involved in his Orange show this spring. Cynthia Vaughn noted Milton is also part of the Tri-Cities Painted Piano project, doing the piano now at Kagen's Coffee and Crepes, Uptown Center.
