Judge Diahann Howard

Diahann started the judging with request for donations from Greg Tripp for the errors in his introduction of his guest, for everyone to donate in honor of Shelly's and Jan's service, and the donation of the 50/50 ticket to our scholarship winner. Diahann quizzed tables on trivia about the Summer Olympics from years past, with mixed results, but more dollars for the club. For Brags, Tom O'Brien reported that his son had a job interview, and hoped it would lead to a job, Larry Lowry

Program

Bob Quay, our Assistant Governor, introduced our new District Governor, Kees Van Der Pol. He was born in the Netherlands, and graduated from college in Victoria, B.C., after which he pursued a 25 year teaching career. He and his wife, Myumi, have two daughters, and four grandchildren, who live in Calgary. He has been a member of the Nakusp Rotary Club in southern British Columbia.

He thanked Larry and Debbie Lowry for their hospitality, along with Dick Richter and the Board for their time and for sharing our club's activities and plan's Monday evening.

Kees said one of the most frequent questions he gets is about Rotary membership and the



declining membership numbers. He reminded everyone that it begins with "an ask" getting that new member involved. Kees recounted the challenges of the Nakusp club, which lost about 20 of its 35 members during a period of internal strife that caused him to leave the club. After several years he rejoined because he missed the fellowship of Rotary; the people and the service projects in the community and globally.

He said the governorship is a shared partnership, and his wife, Myumi, is also a Rotarian, accompanying him to the visits he's made and will make over the next year across District 5080. Myumi then shared her thoughts about the mission trip they took to Ethiopia, traveling with Dr.

Jim Guzcek, and seeing the impact of his life changing cataract surgeries and the gift of service sponsored by Rotary.

Kees urged club members "to take a stand, make a mark", which means taking an action, because otherwise our statements are only words, and are actions are unfulfilled. Contributing our time and talent is gratifying, and represents the best of what Rotary is and does. We take a stand with our Four Way Test and maintaining ethical standards, while making changes in our community. He highlighted the progress of Polio Plus, with only 19 cases in the world year to date, and Rotary's unique position as the only NFP organization that was a signer of the United Nations charter in 1945, and our continued involvement in projects that have global impact. There is much to do, and sometimes we'll focus more on the many challenges, but Kees recounted his experiences of a trip to Pakistan in 2015, against the advice of some as said it was dangerous. Yet they saw the lifesaving administration of polio vaccine to children, and other examples of the Rotary "brand" across that country that represented tremendous service and hope in that country.

Kees closed by highlighting some changes forthcoming this year in the RYLA program; now 3 mini sessions, including one for grades 10-12, as well as some for ages 18-35. There will be an Interact session in January, and the 2017 District meeting will be in Naskup, and his small club, assisted by other area clubs, will be host for the meeting in May, and urged Rotarians to travel the 500 kilometers to this beautiful area.
