There was a lengthy discussion regarding the Rebuilding Mid-Columbia tool trailer, to be continued after the Multi-Club Service Committee meets in August to discuss the same issue. The

other two projects will be addressed by the appropriate sub-committees as new business for this Rotary year.

Closing out the meeting was an open discussion led by Jan Griffin regarding the need for communication between the Richland Rotary Board, the Community Services Committee and the Multi-Club Service Committee when addressing overlapping projects. Andrew Cook proposed looking into creating an electronic information distribution process to keep track of the status of various issues affecting all of the interested parties.

### **New Generations**

This Committee discussed the High School Academic Scholarship and Nursing Scholarship selection timelines. The group agreed the current timeline of high school scholarship applications due at the end of March and scholarship recognition for recipients in May; and Nursing Scholarship applications due the end of April with their recognition at a meeting in June or July worked well. The next topic discussed was the selection process for the two scholarships with brainstormed suggestions for potential changes. The following ideas are based on our feedback and what fellow Rotarians shared with the Committee, but no decisions about changes were made:

# **High School Academic Scholarships:**

- Using a 10 point vs. a 5 point scale for rating students' application categories,
- Giving more weight to financial need with the challenge being how to get information to identify this need,
- Consider some of the scholarships be designated for high school students pursing vocational/ technical training, This number would be dependent on total scholarships available.

# **Nursing Scholarships:**

• Consider having one of these scholarships be for EMT career path students.

The use of electronic applications vs. paper copies to review and select scholarship awards was

also discussed. It was agreed committee members need more time to review applications before meeting as a committee to make our final selections. Electronically scanned applications might be the best option, especially if the Committee has more than 20 applications total to review, which occurred this year. The Committee also plans to meet in October or November to finalize plans for 2020.

# **Meeting Services**

Games: There was a discussion about new games and introducing something different to compliment the weekly 50/50. We will try playing BINGO on business meeting days to bring in more Foundation donations.

**Greeters:** The Red Badge members will be cycled through as Greeters more often to help them earn Blue Badge points and get their book signed.
