Gary led the 50/50 with \$28 in the pot. Ken Williams took the \$10.


The Honorable Judge Lowry

Judge Larry Lowry asked for brags and confessions, and pointed out some nice recent newspaper articles from Chris Meiers and C Mark Smith.

He then led the club through a quiz on Rotary statistics focused on polio (2.5 billion vaccinated worldwide by Rotary over 150 countries; Gates Foundation being the #1 supporter, followed up by the US Congress. Last year, between 12-22 cases were reported in total, which is up from the previous year.

Program


Today's program was led by Andrea Riggs from You-Medical, previously known as Tri-Cities Pregnancy Network.



You-Medical for sexual health and pregnancy, is a faith based organization located in Kennewick and Pasco. They opened in 1998 and renamed in July of 2017. They are focused on Prevention, Intervention, and Restoration. They do this through a number of programs:

- Stronger Youth a prevention program with Kennewick, Southridge, and Richland High, along with the Juvenile Detention Center. They offer classes now, and hope to offer STD/STI screening next year.
- Medical Services pregnancy tests and ultrasounds, primarily now offered through the Mobile Ultrasound bus, paid for from a grant from Focus on the Family
- 3. Moms Empowered offering counseling on the three choices available to pregnant women, offering a "learning and earning" education program, and offering classes at Tri-Tech and New Horizons.

- 4. Stronger Fathers led by Brandon Gregory, hired two years ago fulltime. Supports men to be confident fathers and husbands
- 5. Care Where Healing Happens discussing healing from emotional, sexual, or spiritual hurts.

Previous donations from the Richland Rotary helped support the Boutique they have that provides necessary infant supplies (clothes, diapers, etc)

Andrea said they best ways to get involved are: Volunteer, attend an event such as Walk for Life, make a financial donation, or come in for a tour.
