## The Program

Carol Moser is no stranger to our members and our podium. We already know her as an accomplished woman with a long record of service on the Richland City Council and the Washington State Transportation Commission. She last spoke at our club on the topic of transportation.

Today Carol came to us as the Executive Director for the Benton-Franklin Community Health Alliance. The Alliance is a collaborative of the area's four hospitals, Group Health and Public Health. Carol oversees seven committees, the Alliance Consistent Care Program, and most recently, the Accountable Communities of Health Planning Grant for Benton-Franklin, Walla Walla, Columbia, Garfield, and Asotin Counties.



Carol told us that A Community Health Needs Assessment Survey was conducted between August 2011 and December 2012 which resulted in a Community Health Improvement Plan. To formulate the improvement plan her Alliance partnered with 90 organizations including community health care providers such as BF Health, Tri-Cities hospitals and state government health agencies. Together

they created a vision statement. Our Community is a place where we experience wellbeing by: Fostering social, physical, emotional, vocational and spiritual wellness. Empowering people to make healthy choices in a safe environment. Coordinating access to comprehensive, affordable and integrated health care services for all.

The strategic issues they identified were: How do we address obesity (the population in B-F counties is the 9th most obese in the state.), How do we improve access to health care? They found that there are 47K uninsured in B-F counties and our hospitals have \$52 mil in uncompensated care costs. Even though we have plenty of urgent care facilities available a large percentage of our population are using our hospital emergency rooms as their primary care facility.

The goals formulated to address these problems are: Community members will make more healthy food choices, Community members will be more physically active, promote breast feeding and improve child nutrition. Resources will be identified to lessen the barriers and costs of health care, The community will experience coordinated health care, The healthy system will have the capacity to meet the needs of the community.

The practical application of all this surveying, formulating and planning boils down to educating and involving our citizens in the process. Getting people to recognize the problems and engaging them in finding the solutions.


