Program

Today's speaker was introduced by Diahann. Wendy Higgens of the Lodge at Columbia Point. Ms.

Higgins has been associated with the parent company of the Lodge, Escape Lodging, and the CEO, Tom Drumheller for nearly 20 years. Prior to coming here about a year ago she was with Escape for 14 years at a property in Cannon Beach, Oregon. She is here with her husband, a cabinet maker, and they have three children and three grandchildren. Wendy said that Tom had been working on putting a lodge in this area for twelve years. He is from Walla Walla originally and thought the area was ready for something more luxurious and personal that the hotel chains in the area.

Escape Lodging specializes in special properties, where they build or restore small to medium size



hotels, inns, lodges, townhome developments, restaurants and clubs in the Pacific Northwest. They are known for a sense of whimsy and fun in the developments. Wendy said it is a company with a heart that values their employees and is a great place to work.

The Lodge at Columbia Point has been open for about six weeks. It has a wine country theme. It was supposed to open late last year, January at the latest. The bad winter weather put the final construction and finish work way behind schedule. She talked about the weather delays, where a truckload of carpet had to go back to Spokane because it couldn't get into the storage area to unload. They did unload some furniture in the icy weather at her husband's shop, by sliding the boxes down the ice-covered driveway slope.

They did a soft opening and now have the 82 guest rooms, wine bar (guests only for now) and pool open, but waiting for final approvals for the spa. Each of the rooms is named for a local winery and those wineries have been asked to do tastings at the lodge. They have gotten rave reviews. They have a Lodge puppy, a yellow Lab named Marilyn Merlot. So far they have hosted many groups, taking 15 to 30 rooms at a time. Wendy said she has had more groups here in 6 weeks than would get in a year at her Cannon Beach property. They have also hosted various events such as wedding receptions in their Boardroom.
