Our program today featured two of newest members who talked about their interests. Connie Corcoran received her B.S. in Chemical engineering in 1990 from the University of North Dakota. She currently works for Lucas Engineering and Management Services which is located in Richland. If they do this, the coal trains will pass through the Tri-Cities on their way to shipping terminals at Boardman, Longview and Bellingham. She described the potential traffic delays from 100-car coal trains and the environmental and health concerns associated with coal spills and dust.
