Program

Gary described the meanings of the term "Sustainability" in an economic development framework and listed various programs going on

in the Tri-Cities. He noted at a recent report prepared for TRIDEC by a site selection consultant was critical about the fact that the Tri-Cities does not have comprehensive sustainability plan, although their findings didn't recognize a number of programs that are on-going in our region.


