It began when any exposure to the arts was a most uncommon occurrence. Since its onset, it has given us affordable concerts to play to every taste. In its early years, one had to have been invited to join. Seating was limited. The situation has evolved to an active quest for enrollment. In this era, there is no bad seat. The facilities at Faith Assembly in Pasco and Richland High School are most adequate. Handicap seating is plentiful.

A series of video vignettes was shown, depicting the coming artists for this season. It was sufficient to ignite interest. There was one of the Vienna Boys' Choir. They were singing, if we were not mistaken, an excerpt from Orff's "Carmina Burana".
