



Program

Gordon Bopp introduced Andrea Riggs, Executive Director of the Tri-Cities Pregnancy Network. She is a native of the area, graduating from Kamiakin High School. After moving back from Phoenix, and earning her MBA from Washington State University, Andrea first began at the Pregnancy Network as a Volunteer, before working her way up to Director. The Agency was founded in 1988, and has offices in Richland and Kennewick, and its mission is to provide confidential, compassionate care to young women who find themselves pregnant, and often do not have a strong family support system. 54% of their clients are between 15-24 years of age, and 64% come from broken homes, with backgrounds in abuse or addition environments. Andrea said she feels a special kinship to her clients as she first became a mother at age 17. It is important to be non judgemental, to listen, offer information and support. These women are often feeling overwhelmed and frightened, and the Pregnancy Network wants to support the this young mother and their

baby, to give them a better chance of providing a stable and healthy environment in which to raise the child. It is also important to involve the fathers, even if the mother and father are no longer a couple, and the Network is seeing more interest by young men who are attending classes with the mothers to be. Their organization is now developing educational programs to engage these young men, focusing on positive role models for fatherhood, and being active in their child's life.
