She comes from Los Alamos, where her husband was an experimental physicist. Leslie used to be a professor at the University of Arizona, teaching courses in English, Film, and television. She was an Air Force brat, born in Spain, moving to Japan, and ultimately Maryland.

At the RPL, Leslie is involved in creating learning kits for other libraries, which the RPL is able to do since it does not have to expend so much of its budget on community services like so many other libraries do. The RPL is working on its hospitality programs. Everyone needs to be able to get something different from the RPL, whether it is peace and quiet, story time for children, or study rooms for college students. The RPL tries to be fair and equitable to all.

The RPL is #1 in the state for Library programs, and #1 for program attendance. Just last weekend, the RPL held a wound/blister makeup applying program for kids and adults alike in anticipation of Halloween. Spooky!

The RPL is getting more use each year, not less. Over 500,000 items have been checked out so far this year, and over 25,000 computer sessions have taken place.



The RPL strives to protect intellectual freedoms by including banned books in its system, and to protect individual privacy by working with vendors to make sure an individual's checkout history isn't revealed to the public.
