Be a gift to the world

Mike talked about the heart of Rotary, and how important that is with all the changes Rotary has undergone in recent years. While he originally joined Rotary for networking early in his career, it has been Rotary's work in the community and around the world that has changed his heart. He described his "Ah-ha" moments, noting that these are experienced by many Rotarians. His first came when someone gave him him a VCR tape of the Wheelchair Project, which raised funds to send wheelchairs to the countries around the world where people without ability to walk were forced to crawl or drag themselves to get outside or go anywhere. It moved him so much that his club adopted this project, raising funds and getting matching grants, with their that allowed them to purchase a container of 1500 wheelchairs. They brought them to South America, and were amazed by the reactions of the disabled persons when they realized what mobility and freedom this \$75 wheelchair would bring to their lives. He cited the example of Dr. Santos, a Filipino physician, who submitted an idea to RI to give two drops of polio vaccine to children in the Phillipines, to make the country polio free, which became the genesis of the Polio Plus campaign that started in 1985. The first year of the campaign there were 385,000 cases in the world, and so far this year there have been 41, in Pakistan, the one remaining country in which polio still occurs. If we can complete the eradication of this disease from the earth by 2020 or 2021, because they must be polio free for at least one year, what will Rotary do next next? What will be the next big idea? If you have passion and have an idea that could benefit our worldwide community, please share it with your President, or District Governor, because it could change the world.

He reminded the members of this year's theme "Be a gift to the World", and mentioned that in a survey of Rotarians on why they joined and stayed in Rotary, 92% initially said that they want to do things, but that dropped to 86% in a few years. So whether your world is local or worldwide,

channel that enthusiasm and interest to make a difference, and be a gift to our world!
