
Announcements

Judge Tom Cowan presided and didn't waste



Program

Richland Rotarian Mark Smith continued his record of memorable (or less than memorable, depending on your point of view) program presentations to Richland Rotary after his intended remarks were recovered from the hotel's dumpster just before he was to speak. The coffee grounds and salad dressing stains didn't help the cogency of his remarks which may have already been suspect.

Mark talked about his new book, Community Godfather: How Sam Volpentest shaped the history of Hanford and the Tri-Cities. Sam was a Tri-Cities icon who lived and worked for 101 years and became the "go-to" contact if federal funding was required for a Hanford or community project (which was often). Sam was an honorary member of our club and an honorary Paul Harris fellow. The ballroom in which we meet is named for him.

From 1957 to 2005, Sam was one of the community's greatest cheerleaders and its greatest lobbyist. He made hundreds of trips to Washington, D.C. on the community's behalf. Back there, he was known as a highly-skilled, tenacious and persistent lobbyist who would not take "no" for an answer.



Smith interviewed more than 70 individuals

for his book. It combines their oral history accounts with contemporary news accounts to paint a nuanced account of this complicated man and the role Sam played in Richland's incorporation, his efforts to save the economic future of Richland and the Tri-Cities, and the economic development efforts that made the Tri-Cities what it is today. The book provides the background stories, still vivid in the memories of those interviewed, about how things actually happened—stories you wouldn't read in the paper.

The book will be available to those who have already ordered it, through local bookstores, and online, in late November or early December, just in time for Christmas. 500 pages +/-, 70 pictures, endnotes, bibliography, and index.
