Josh Cuevas is fresh out of the Marine Corps. He always wanted to be a Marine and enlisted right out of high school. He travelled all around the world and credited the many mentors he had in the Corps. He now tries to do the same thing with WSU students who have been in the Marine Corps. He said he appreciated the service work that groups like Rotary do. He told several stories of examples of service provided individuals and groups that he witnessed while in the Corps.











Emmanual Bonilla grew up in Richland as an undocumented "Dreamer" whose parents brought him to the US illegally when he was a child. He joined the Air Force and obtained his citizenship while in the service. He served in the Middle East, married a girl from Kennewick and returned to go to WSU Tri-Cities on the GI bill.

Anne Taylor served in the Coast Guard. She wanted to drive tanks in the army, but was told that women were not allowed in the tank program. She went to the Coast Guard, asked them if they had any jobs women couldn't do. They said no, and she joined up. She served for six years as an aircraft flight mechanic and flight chief.

The take-away from the meeting is that our service members are awesome and they are adding a lot to WSUTC and to our community.
