Sexual Assault Response Center

The SARC, along with the Domestic Violence Facility and the Crime Victim Service Center, are services we wish did not have to exist. However, the realities of present-day life have not only generated them, but have oversubscribed their facilities. A disturbing thought is that not all of those who much need them pass through their portals. What may lurk undetected and unreported is disquieting to contemplate.

Renee Blackman, SARC's Special Victims' Advocate, gave some history and dwelt mostly on the services it offers. It was originally named Rape Relief prior to its name change. It began in 1977, founded by three victims. It is non-profit and is funded by WA State, United Way, and private donations.

Services:

- Crisis Line, 374-5391, is available 24 hours a day, providing both emotional support or referral for those needing immediate assistance.
- Legal and Medical Advocacy. Response to hospital calls is a basic service, as well as medical assistance to sexual assault victims. Legal advocacy occurs at police interviews and in court.
- Crisis Intervention. While short-term support is offered, they advise sexual assault/abuse counseling.
- Therapy Referrals. Victims are directed to appropriate counselors. Cost counseling is also given. Sources of financial support can be identified when the need exists.
- Support Groups. These groups provide support to adult victims, non-offending parents, and family members of child and teen victims.
- On-Site Counseling. A full-time specialized counselor is available. Six sessions are offered at no charge.

Education Program, Directed to Sexual Assault Prevention

- Sunshine Puppet Theater. The puppets aid in teaching children to recognize inappropriate touches, and to resist them. K-2nd grade.
- P.S. Happy Bear. Preschool. Good and bad touching orientation.
- Personal Body Safety. 8-11. This teaches children to seek help from appropriate adults.
- Parent Education. This instructs parents regarding possible abuse, offender behavior, and how to respond to abuse disclosure.
- Sexual harassment. Students to adults. Instruction given as to sexually harassing behavior and how to stop it in schools and the workplace.
- Internet Safety. All ages. Examples of internet threats and risks are given. Instruction is provided as to how to protect oneself on the internet.
- Date/Acquaintance Rape Prevention. High school to college. Recognition instruction regarding warning signs and abusive behaviors is provided. Safety is taught, as well as prevention against becoming offenders.
- General Sexual Assault Information. This tells of child sexual abuse, offenders, adult survivors, rape, the law, and preventive measures.

Summarizing: A comprehensive, compartmentalized approach to a disturbingly prevalent problem.

Coming Governor: The nominee for 2012-2013 is Michelle Lee of the Colville club.
