### Judge Tom Kirchner

### **Program**

Our speaker today was Jim Hall, the director of government and community relations at Kadlec Regional Medical Center since 1994. Jim hosts weekly television and radio programs on behalf of Kadlec. Prior to joining Kadlec, Jim spent 12 years at KEPR-TV. He is a native of Prosser and lives in Richland.

Jim took us through the 70-year history of Kadlec, including how it came to be named for Lt. Col. Harry Kadlec. Col. Kadlec was one of the army hospital's first patients. He was the Deputy Area Engineer and Chief of Construction at Hanford



and, as Col. Franklin Mathias's deputy, a key figure in the operation of the project. Col. Kadlec was said to have worked himself to death, suffering a heart attack on July 2, 1944 and becoming the first death in the new facility. On July 10, 1944, the Richland Hospital was renamed for him.

Jim went through the growth of the facility over the years and its changing role in the community and the region. He described the growth of specialty medical services at Kadlec that has eliminated the need for local residents to travel to Spokane or Seattle for specialized treatment, noting that one of his most important roles is to convince people that the health care that they receive here is equal to or better than they can receive elsewhere.

He noted that one of the continuing problems is convincing the state that Kadlec needs additional bed capacity to meet local needs. The hospital is currently licensed for 270 beds but needs more. Kadlec draws not only from Benton and Franklin counties but from a 90-mile surrounding area in Washington and Oregon.

The partnership with Providence Health and Services is allowing Kadlec to add needed facilities and services that it would not otherwise been able to afford, including a new specialty physician office

building, the addition of four new floors on the River Pavilion tower, a new 600-car parking garage, freestanding remote emergency room facilities, urgent care facilities, the new Kadlec Healthplex facility, new educational partnerships with WSU Tri-Cities and Columbia Basin College, and a new residency program.
