Judge Jim

Jim Bauer tried his hand at being judge for the first time. He said he had been coached by Jon Putz, but he did a credible job anyway. Ken Williams was late. Jim encouraged members to wear their Paul Harris pins. Ruth Swain and Jerry McGuire celebrated a birthday. Mike Winegardner is celebrating his fourth Rotary anniversary. Connie Corcoran noted that they raised \$75,000 at the Beggar's Banquet for Safe Harbor. Jim went through the normal football victories and defeats. It was noted the George Sanders hasn't been showing up much at Rotary this season given Florida's record.

Jim provided some statistics about the annual giving by Rotarians worldwide. He said that 90% percent of the money raised by the Rotary Foundation went to the projects themselves; only 2% on fundraising and 8% goes for administration. American clubs give by far the largest amount of money, but rank only 11th in the world when it comes to per capita giving at \$111 per Rotarian.

Program

Pat Haggerty introduced Larry Christianson, director of fundraising for the Kadlec Foundation. Larry noted that a number of Richland Rotarians are involved with Kadlec in various capacities and thanked them for their service.

He started by providing a general description of the Kadlec Health System. Kadlec employs more than 2300 people and brings hundreds of millions of dollars into the local economy. The hospital is expected to provide \$30 million in charity care in 2013.

Larry talked about the current fundraising drive to fund the new neo-natal intensive care unit (NICU) at Kadlec. Forty percent of all the babies born at Kadlec come from families who live outside the Tri-

Cities. The old NICU has been outgrown. Several years ago, Kadlec had a successful fundraising campaign to build a new \$7.5 million pediatric care center. The NICU campaign is an outgrowth of that. Once completed, the NICU will include a renovated and expanded Intermediate Care Nursery and Level III Neonatal Intensive Care Unit. The number of rooms will grow from 17 to 27 and the new rooms will be larger and more capable. The unit will grow in size from 3,000 square feet to 15,000 square feet.

So far, the campaign has raised \$6,077,344 of a \$9 million construction goal, but that number doesn't include soft costs like furniture. The campaign has received national attention and recognition in the medical fundraising press. Because of the importance of the project and immediate need, Kadlec has elected to begin construction of the NICU. He encouraged each of us to contribute to the campaign if they can.


