Gordon Bopp introduced today's speaker, Paul Casey. Paul has been a professional speaker for more than 20 years and is one of the leading authorities on leadership and personal growth. He is the 2014 recipient of the 2014 Best of Richland Award for Business Development Service. He provides a daily inspirational growth message on local radio and has written a book, The Static Cling Principle, reminding us that what we allow to attach to our lives will determine our future.

Paul introduced us to the world of Lions, Otters, Golden Retrievers and Beavers. Lions are bold leaders, Otters are quick-witted, Golden Retrievers are warm and loving, and Beavers are structured and organized. He had us all take a short test to determine what each of us is and provided tips for



each species. He then provided a list of do's and don'ts for each category.

Lions were encouraged to be first to apologize, lead, don't push, and develop a plan of encouraging others (verbally or written). Let people offer opinions without cutting them off or putting them down, listen to what people are saying to you, then allow your heart to open, learn to compromise and cooperate with others and learn to relax so you won't become a workaholic. Do Not: expect everyone to want to do it your way, intimidate others, or expect everyone to produce as you do.

Otters were encouraged to finish what you start or delegate, so you can keep commitments, listen more; talk less, Face reality, keep a personal calendar and keep a schedule, make lists, and be on time. Do Not: Interrupt nor add to others' stories or overcommit yourself to too many projects.

Golden Retrievers were encouraged to develop a plan to keep heading toward growth, communicate your feelings so people will relate to you, focus on your strengths instead of your weaknesses, be a risk taker, trust your own abilities, and realize your tendency toward laziness. Do Not: let resentment build or be a wet blanket on others' ideas.

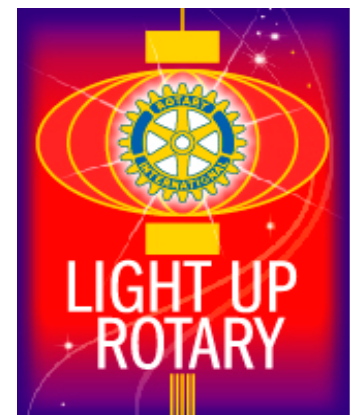
