"Cheermaster" Diahann always seems to end her stint on the bench with something for the rest of us to remember. Today, it was five regrets people express on their death beds:

#### **Program**

Pat Haggerty introduced Marcee Woffinden, the Nutrition Services Director for Senior Life Resources Northwest who spoke to us about the Meals on Wheels program. Meals on Wheels is one of three senior programs provided by Senior Life Resources, a local nonprofit agency serving seniors since 1974. Their mission is to help people remain in their own homes as long as possible. Other programs include a very large home care business that provides services from Snoqualmie Pass to the Idaho border. They have about 400 employees. The second is a



small senior health care training program that trains home care providers.

The Meals on Wheels program in our area operates 7 senior dining centers which are located throughout Benton and Franklin Counties. Seniors are welcome to have lunch at these centers which are typically located in senior or community centers.

Home delivered meals are served to those who are essentially homebound, have difficulty preparing balanced meals, or have no one in the home willing or able to prepare their meals. Meals are served hot and ready to eat 5 days a week, with frozen meals available for holidays or weekends. Menus are prepared by a Registered Dietitian and all home delivered meals are delivered by volunteers. Last year, 290 volunteers served 147, 070 meals to 1,736 clients, donated 22,235 hours, and drove 75,618 miles.

Funding comes from three sources. About one-third of the required funding comes from government sources, another third comes from community funding (donations, United Way, fundraising (including Richland Rotary), and another third comes from volunteer hours and reduced rents at the senior dining centers. Ninety percent of all monies raised goes directly into program services.
