Blaine Carr, Rotarian

He was introduced by sibling Terri LeBlanc. She read some of his history, to wit, Moses Lake origin, schools attended, CPA degree, current position, interest in sports, church activities, and classification in financial planning. Blaine expressed his thanks to all, feels it is an honor, and looks forward to meeting the members and having the opportunity to serve. Ruth Swain's charge made note of the Four Way Test, made some points about community service and stated that, although we have done much, there is still a long way to go. Blaine is to be part of the continuing effort.

Justin Raffe

Art Kohler, sponsor, introduced Justin, a man with a strong musical background. A tenor, he has sung in many places, before many audiences, and in association with eminent musicians. He is also a musician. He has been a choral conductor and has led choruses of singers. Also, he has a relatively long history in Interact. In his opening remarks as a Rotarian, Justin fully expected that he'd be destined for musical club service, specifically singing. He notes that his created classification, Small Business/Music, is a first. He expects to keep us aware of the arts. Ed Revell's charge made note of Justin's Interact history, that he is a leader in his vocation. He dwelt on the principles of service and the Service Above Self concept. He bade the new member -- and all of us – to judge ourselves by the Four Way Test.

Judge Larry

The center of all anticipation, George S. handled it with class...latecomers and a sibling's sponsor, a 32nd anniversary celebrator, the Prezz's anniversary, all enriched the till...Several global travelers announced their intentions...A proposition was offered as to Army/Navy. The judge assured us he'll be back.

School Levy

We heard from Assistant Superintendent Mike Kirby and Marilyn Allen, head of the bond issue. It was a stop, undoubtedly, on the circuit in which the rationale for passage of the levy is explained. History shows that the exhortation is invariably successful.

Kirby, aided by power point, made these assertions:

- The School District is an excellent preparer of students to enter society.
- 31% of the students receive lunch, which is free or reduced.
- RHS Theater Arts, Band-Orchestra-Choir, HHS Musicians have distinguished themselves
- Academic excellence
- Budget crisis survived via attrition of teaching positions and use of the unreserved fund; rental fees.
- 2003 bond projects completed on time and within budget.
- Delta HS opened; first STEM high school in state.
- Partnerships with local businesses, service clubs, Battelle, contractors, PTA/O Volunteers, churches.
- Current operations levy expires at the end of 2010. Levy makes up 15% of operating budget. State does not fully fund education.

Allen's remarks included the reality that poverty is increasing in the current economic climate, and that support is needed. She told of success stories as a result of passage of previous levies. She alluded to the music and art entertainment that the schools have provided Rotary. All told, it is time to replace the levy, a process that Richland has always done.
