COMMITTEE SPENDING

Community Impact Committee

Budget \$45,500 - Grants Given \$52,493***

The Community Impact Committee provided grant awards to 20 different community service organizations. Our committee partnered with the Youth Services Committee on 4 requests, and we received matching funds from Rotary District 5080 to help respond to local wildfire relief efforts. Highlights include grants to Wishing Star Foundation for gift cards during the holidays and MusicFest Northwest for facilities rental expenses. The committee provided support for gas and maintenance to keep Feed Spokane's delivery vans running and support for the Bite2Go program at Stevens Elementary. The Community Impact Committee evaluated how best to leverage member donated dollars for maximum impact where the community expressed a pressing need.

Disability Services Committee

Budget \$25,000 - Grants Given \$25,878*

The Disability Services committee participated in awarding a total of 13 grants while leveraging an additional \$20,000 by partnering with other organizations. Among the grants awarded, we provided a therapeutic pony for physical therapy, prosthetic liners, a prosthetic leg, custom wheelchair, wagons, dentures, hearing aids, a bed, and partial funding for a van. This year was exceptional, with many creative and impactful ways to support and bless individuals in our community. The collaborative efforts and innovative solutions have made a significant difference in the lives of those we serve.

Foster KidFest Committee

Budget \$4,200 - Grants Given \$1,764*

The Foster KidFest Committee hosted 22 foster families and 74 children at various events throughout the year. Beginning with a stargazing event in the fall, a roller-skating party in the spring, and the 15th traditional KidFest party at Mobius Discovery Center. Some of the events are designed to support area foster families and celebrate the stability they provide for children in foster care. The traditional KidFest party is designed to bring children in foster care together with the potential of finding their forever families. In total, 65 children have been adopted as a result of this event since inception and 7 more children are in transition to their forever families from the most recent KidFest party. That's an adoption rate over 51%. The magic continues!

International Services Committee

Budget \$35,000 - Grants Given & Committed \$36,000***

The International Services Committee supported 9 grant projects this Rotary year and also supported International Exchange students (1 for full year, 1 for short term). They awarded grants in several countries, Thailand (eye exams and glasses), Ecuador (clean water in rural NW), Belize (school equipment in concert with other 5080 clubs), Fiji (water in concert with other 5080 clubs), India (cleft lip and palate surgeries with Rotaplast and Kenya (HIV education, school desks, school sinks, scholarships for high school students). They continue to work on a Global Grant with a Maasai women's CBO in Kisamis, Kenya. The grant is nearing completion.

Youth Services Committee

Budget \$45,000 - Grants Given \$52,883*

The Youth Services Committee awarded 25 grants to community organizations to improve the lives of youth in our community. Grants included support for programs involving childhood hunger, urban native youth, youth job internships, youth clothing, Rotaract, childhood cancer, refugees, early learning, youth sports, and youth leadership. The committee also made cash awards to two emerging artists in dancing, and the visual arts.

Support Our Veterans Committee

Budget \$10,000 - Grants Given \$12,551*

The Support Our Veterans committee awarded 14 grants to community organizations including support to for Honor Flight to help aging veterans visit the WWII, Korea, and Vietnam memorials in Washington D.C. supporting veterans career transitions into vital agricultural jobs essential for food security (Vets on the Farm), Lockers for Homeless Veterans to store their personal belongings (Volunteers of America), school supplies for active duty members families out at Fairchild AFB (Operation Homefront), providing necessities & essential household items to Veterans, active military & their families during the holidays (Newby-Ginnings Christmas Program, 2 families), and restocking an emergency food pantry for veteran families in need (Newby-Ginnings).

COMMITTEE SPENDING

Vaccinations Committee

Budget \$2,500 - Grants Given \$370

The Vaccinations Committee was founded in the 2017-2018 Rotary year. Since then, it has supported about 35 health clinics and supported the vaccination of an estimated 1,000 people. In the Rotary year 2023-2024, the committee supported two health fairs for the Slavic community (including Ukrainian refugees) to promote health and wellness and connect them with local health resources. The committee provided snacks, crafts, and game tables for the children and handed out free hats. The committee also supported a vaccination clinic for school-age children on May 23 at Stevens Elementary School. Again, the committee provided games, snacks, and free hats.

Vocational Services Committee

Budget \$15,340 - Grants Given \$17,863*

During meetings this year, the Vocational Service Committee honored 14 students. The students recognized were seniors in Spokane Public Schools and represented five large area high schools and four project & option schools within the district. Additional funds earned, through the successful RCS Campaign and March Madness Event(s), allowed the committee to grant six students awards of \$1500 each in scholarships. The scholarship awardees will use this fund towards their post-high school academic institution or vocational program of their choosing within the next two years. In addition, the committee selected five students to receive the Katy Reeves Performing Arts Scholarship. Thank you for your work in recognizing and awarding these exceptional students this year. We look forward to continuing to work alongside you this coming year in Rotary 21 and on the Vocational Service Committee.
