## **FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS:**

**Who is Greater Spokane Valley Rotary?** The Greater Spokane Valley Rotary Club is one of the most viable Rotary clubs in Eastern Washington. We're a group of local business leaders and community advocates dedicated to fundraising that supports the public good. Our major events include our food booth at the Spokane County Fair, Celebration of Lights, Breakfast with Santa and this Derby.

**What's a Challenge Series Race?** The Greater Spokane Valley Rotary Derby is like a soap box derby, also called a coaster car race, is a youth soapbox car racing program which has been run in the United States since 1934. The cars in this race fit two children; one Driver and one passenger (Racer). The Driver has control of the car and the brakes. The Racer has a mock steering wheel with no connection and/or control of the car.

**What are the cars like?** The cars have a steering wheel and a brake. The cars are maintained and safety concerns are addressed. Extra padding is provided if necessary. Helmets are also provided and required for both Racers and Drivers. Feel free to bring your own helmet!

**Does Greater Spokane Valley Rotary have liability insurance?** We have a Certificate of Insurance placing this race under the liability insurance of Rotary International.

**Are the Drivers trained?** Yes. Training is Friday, June 14, 2019 at 6:30 PM in the parking lot of the Liberty Lake Golf Course. **ALL Drivers MUST** attend this mandatory training even if they have past experience. The Drivers will be tested again on race day prior to each heat. It is at the sole discretion of Greater Spokane Valley Rotary to remove any Drivers if they are unable to control the car at any time, even if they successfully 'passed' the Driver training.

**Where is the course?** Molter Rd at Liberty Lake Pavillion Park, between E Country Vista Rd and Valley Way.

**Are the roads blocked off?** Yes.

**How are the cars, drivers and racers returned to the start line?** The kids remain in the car and an ATV tows the car and kids back to the starting line. No rides will be given on the ATV's themselves.

**Is there wheelchair user transport, etc?** Parents are responsible to transport their special needs kids to and from the Liberty Lake Pavillion Park. Several volunteers will assist Racers into and out of the car.

**How many heats per child with special needs?** That depends on the number of entrants. Typically a child has the opportunity for 4-5 rides.

**Height/Weight Restrictions:** Due to the small Soap Derby cars, racers must be 5'2" or less in height and 110 pounds or less in weight. Extra padding is provided for small children.

**Time of Heats:** Group A 8:30 AM to 10:30; Group B 10:30 AM to Noon; Lunch starts at 11:00 AM.
