American Cancer Society –Relay for Life 2018

Kimber Griffiths and Mike Powell from the American Cancer Society spoke to us about the work that ACS does and the upcoming Relay for Life event in Genesee County.

Kimber said that \$390.3 million of donation made to the organization over the past 25 years have gone toward research. There are currently 22 ACS researchers in Michigan supported by \$12.5 million in funding.

ACS also prioritizes early detection and prevention., promoting the use of sunscreen, the HPV vaccine and health screenings such as colonoscopies.

They are looking for volunteers for their Road to Recovery program, a program that transports patients to and from doctor appointments and treatments. More than 2400 rides were given in Genesee County in 2017, she said, plus an addition 1200 rides through MTS were available.

There is also the Look Good Feel Better program that provides classes on how to feel better about changes in appearance due to cancer treatment. Wigs are given to cancer patients who lose their hair at no cost.

The ACS also supports Hope Lodge, free lodging for a patient and one caregiver during away-from-home treatments. In Michigan alone, the ACS Hope Lodge provided more than 11,600 free nights stay, coupled with 1,200 free hotel nights in areas that don't have a Hope Lodge nearby. This represented a total out-of-pocket savings to patients of \$1.9 million.

The ACS also provides people diagnosed with cancer with a Personal Health Management Kit that includes information specific to their type of cancer. More than 500 kits were distributed in Genesee County in 2017.

Kimber also said that the national support line is one of the best resources available to people diagnosed with cancer or their families. It receives 3,041 calls on weekdays, 492 calls over the weekend and averages 350 calls per hour. The number is 1-800-227-2345 and is open 24 hours a day, seven days a week. The Genesee County Relay for Life event will be June 23 & 24 from 10 a.m. to 10 a.m. at the Dort Event Center. She said the beauty of being indoors this year is that there will be no bugs and it won't matter if it rains. The theme is Disney, and there will be games, laser tag, a silent auction, a vendor fair, the luminaria ceremony at 10 p.m. and a survivor lap at 6 p.m.
