Our speaker for Sept. 23 was Jason Carlisle, Assistant Principal of the Genesee Career Institute. He told us about the career and technical education programs available through the Genesee Intermediate School District—everything from forensic science to welding.

He talked to us about the on-site instruction and experiential learning in many career areas that help prepare Genesee County students for immediate entry into the workforce, upon completion of high school and the GCI program.

The institute also offers opportunities for students to gain advanced exposure to knowledge and skill sets in preparation for moving on to post-secondary education in their chosen field, and can even lead to college credit for courses taken at GCI.

They are also the site of the Base Camp Challenge Center, the Genesee Creation Corner and Shear Style Salon. Creation Corner and Shear Style give students


