Rotary is an international service organization made up of business and professional leaders interested in the welfare of their local community and the world. Rotary is the largest international volunteer service organization in the world with 1.2 million members.

- Volunteering at the Food Bank of Eastern Michigan;
- Sponsoring literacy programs.



What is expected of a Rotarian in the Rotary Club of Flint?

A commitment to Rotary is important not only to the local club, but to the organizations that it serves both in the community and worldwide. Individuals should not take the decision to join Rotary lightly. As a member of the Rotary Club of Flint individuals commit to:

- Pay annual dues of \$250, plus \$190 for the Flint Rotary Charitable Foundation and the cost of weekly meeting meals (currently \$18);
- Serve on a club committee and participate in club events and activities in the community.
