



Introduced By: Kris Miele

It ike spoke about the Belize Medical Supply Project in conjunction with World Medical Relief. Mount Clemens donated \$1,200 to the project last winter, and that donation saved the project, which was in jeopardy due to a



revenue shortfall. The project proposed shipping a container of medical supplies to Orange Walk, Belize. World Medical Relief donated all supplies and equipment. Donations from Rotary clubs and individual Rotarians paid for shipping and packing.

Orange Walk, Belize, has been ravaged by natural disasters, is a rural area, and has limited medical resources because of poverty. Mike shared pictures from the project, including images from the hospital where the supplies were delivered. Orange Walk's local Rotary club was instrumental in getting the project done.

Project costs were \$14,940, which were fully covered by Rotary clubs and a district grant. On March 25, a 40-foot container (1,770 cubic feet) of medical supplies arrived in Orange Walk. All totaled, it contained 14,808 lbs. of medical supplies, valued at \$435,000.

ay Hofner introduced today's speaker, Major Todd Fitzpatrick, commander of the Army Aviation Support Facility at Selfridge (and husband of Jamie Fitzpatrick.) He is a Michigan State grad, first in his class in officer training and a Bronze Star medal recipient.

Major Fitzpatrick gave us a fascinating account of his group and their mission. Their primary aircraft are the big CH-47 Chinook helicopters which play a vital air support role.



They are a national guard group available for domestic service or can be called up for U.S. military duty on short notice.

Their mission includes retrieval of assets such as downed aircraft, air movement operations i.e. transporting troops and supplies, air assault; inserting troops into combat, VIP transport, and "Bambi" operations. These are the firefighting maneuvers where 2,000 gallon buckets are filled in the lakes and then dumped on forest fires.

The group was deployed for combat service in Iraq. More recent domestic missions included air support following hurricane Katrina and firefighting in the Upper Peninsula.

resident-Elect Eric Pierson introduced speaker Kelly Petri, Augmented Alternative Communication Consultant with Dynavox / Mayer-Johnson (www.dynavoxtech.com). This firm was started in 1983 in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, to develop communications devices



for people with speaking disabilities. Users of the products include people with autism, cerebral palsy, ALS, MS, Parkinson's as well as those suffering from impaired or lost speech due to throat cancer, stroke or being on a ventilator. Eight out of 1,000 people cannot use speech to communicate yet only 5% have access to a communications device.

Ms. Petri showed several video clips of how users communicate. Some press keys on a touch screen to speak words. Others type in letters with their fingers or even through a blink of an eye to compose words and sentences that can be played upon command. Augie Nieto, founder of Life Fitness, who suffers from ALS was shown communicating by moving his eye to letters on the screen and then blinking to select the letter. This is the only way he is able to communicate fully with those around him. The devices cost anywhere between \$5,000 and \$15,000. In 2003 insurance carriers began to pay for part of the cost of such devices but unfortunately they remain unaffordable for many people who could benefit from the technology.

The meeting was adjourned at 1:28 p.m.



Program

ur program was introduced by John Walendowski and was about a new water filtration technology called 'Procleanse." The speaker was Fred Segal, from Pennsylvania. This is a water purification system, currently under review with RI that can purify water for folks living in parts of the world where potable water is not available. Water contamination causes 2.2 million deaths per year, 1.3 million are children. According to the W.H.O. nearly 900 million lack access to clean safe drinking water. The UN indicates that 1.2 billion live in areas that have water scarcity, and 2.5 billion lack adequate sanitation facilities leading to water contaminated with deadly bacteria and coliforms. The Procleanse system is suited for folks in parts of the world that have no other means of water filtration. This system can filter contaminated water to be cleaner than tap water, and enough of it to supply a family of four on a daily basis. It is a system that will last about five years per unit. The unit will cost \$150 each. The unit is easy to use. Simply pour water into the first chamber of the unit and gravity drives the water through the diffuser through the two chambers, resulting in clean drinking water coming out of the spout.

The key benefits are: Greater than 99 percent reduction in coliforms *** Clears water: reduces turbidity on average to less than two NTU's. *** Ability to output four liters per hour, enough clean water for cooking and drinking for a family of four. It's easy to transport, weighing less than 60 lbs. before filling. *** Requires no assembly, it is ready to use. *** Effective for five years. *** Rotary International is in processing this system for approval so that this could be paid for through RI funding for third world nations. *** This potentially could be a project similar to the RI wheelchair program. *** For more information, please contact Fred Segal at (724) 384-0300, or at FRSegal@comcast.net



Program

ur program was presented by Mount Clemens Rotarian **Ted Bolak** who spoke about the Macomb Literacy Partners. He was introduced by **Larry Neal**. Ted said on a national level, more than 80 million folks over age 15 are illiterate. Locally, one in ten are illiterate. The Macomb Literacy Partners are committed to eliminating illiteracy.

With funding from many organizations, including Rotary, which has a rich history with MLP, this is happening. MLP provides free tutoring for adults, working one on one with students. This is free for adults, 18 and older. Sessions are about two hours per week, and are conducted on a public site. After about 90 hours of training, students are then assessed for their literacy skills. The tutors are certified volunteers that have undergone about 12-hour of training each. There are 294 students in the program, with 100 in the basic program, and 194 in the English as a second language program. There are 242 tutors in the program and there is a waiting list of about 50 to 60 folks.

The Macomb Literacy Partners are funded by grants and donations, with donations making up 60 percent of the funding. Macomb Literacy Partners also works with local school districts to provide tutoring for students in school. The Macomb Literacy Partners is having its annual Read and Succeed fundraiser on October 12. This will be at the Lorenzo Cultural Center at Macomb Community College, Center Campus. This year's speaker will be Dr. James Jacobs, president of Macomb Community College. Proceeds will go directly to Macomb Literacy Partners. All are welcome to attend. 
Congregational Church at 69619 Parker Street in Richmond.






