om Isett
introduced our
speaker today,
Laura Dyas is the
executive director of
the Michigan Chapter
of the Scleroderma
Foundation.
Scleroderma is an
autoimmune disease
that affects connective

tissues in the sufferer. A symptom of the disease is the cupping of the hands which will eventually lose almost all of the effective function, making difficult nearly any day-to-day chore. In addition, those suffering this rare disease are also very sensitive to the cold. There is no cure or medicinal way to treat the disease itself, but medications are available to help ease the symptoms that come with it. Laura shared that people in her group take between 10 to 42 medications a day.

The Scleroderma Foundation exists to educate and help those suffering from the disease as it is one of the most overlooked and underfunded of debilitating diseases. It takes anywhere from three to five years to diagnose it. Laura played a video and I was surprised that some of the people were diagnosed with this as young as 11 years old. They are looking for funding as a way to continue helping those afflicted and educating hospitals and doctors as to what it is and how they can diagnose this earlier. They also look to help any people who have been recently diagnosed. They have a support group that meets monthly at the Henry Ford Pavilion.

Speaker Presentation

Mary Ann Hosey introduced our speaker today, and for good reason, as she knew him longer than anybody in the room. But know him we do as he is our very own Bob Cannon. Bob has served four consecutive terms as a township trustee and followed it up with four more consecutive terms as the township supervisor which makes him the longest serving politician in Clinton Township.

Bob loves Rotary and has brought several people into the club over his years as a member. He also loves his job as he is able to boast of how great Clinton Township is and how he has been able to watch it blossom into what it is today. Impressive it is, as it boasts two regional hospitals, two colleges and a Big Ten medical school.

Bob started out his presentation with contrasting the differences between townships and cities. The townships are gridded out on (roughly) six mile by six mile squares. Cities are voted in by the townships. More people live in townships in Michigan than in cities.

Bob then highlighted some topics where Clinton Township is leading the way in opposition to, perhaps, the interests of the state of Michigan. One of these things is the legalization of marijuana and facilities selling the same, another is the use of fireworks that were previously banned in Michigan not too long ago. They are also working on banning the lantern fires.

Bob then went on to apprise us of the new things coming to the township. On Hall Road, Kensington Church will be building a new church and two more credit unions will be opening branches there as well. CJ Barrymore's will be adding a roller-coaster and other things that will double their current size. There will also be a luxury apartment complex built by Moceri in the Partridge Creek area and some restaurants that will be coming to George George Park.

He then went on praising the efforts of the Gratiot Avenue DDA that was responsible for things like Baker College coming to the township and said that the next major development on Gratiot will be an overhaul of the bussing that will include taking passengers to the M1 Rail system that will be going up Woodward. He also talked about the problems with the water authority.

Bob talked about some other great things about the township such as the fact that they host the biggest blood drive, the wonderful Festival of the Senses and the Gratiot Cruise which was blessed to have **Don Green** as a grand marshal this year.

Bob concluded that his work was not done and that he intended to run for reelection.







ur speaker was introduced by Elsa S. and it was our very own Sue Coates of Turning Point. Sue wanted to bring us up to speed as to what is happening with the Mount Clemens-based nonprofit. Turning Point has been in existence for



35 years and is a safety net for domestic violence in Macomb County. Turning Point receives 12,000 calls and treats up to 400 people a year all with a budget of \$3 million. Turning Point is committed to ending the use of violence as a means of oppressing and controlling others, and provides services that help people regain power over their lives. The biggest segment of the population at risk are teens. Primarily because they don't know where to go to seek help. They provide forensic nurse examination, counseling, 24-hour crisis line, support groups, youth and family programs, summer camps and trips to see the Tigers. Most of the funding comes from federal, community and private donations. Currently the State of Michigan does not assist with funding. Sue has introduced the "The Four-Way Test soccer ball" to the kids and teaching them something about what Rotary is about. Way to go Sue. The emergency shelter is at 158 S. Main and they have "Second Hand Rose" resale shop to provide a source of income and help with basic needs. October is Domestic Violence Month and they are having two fundraisers 10/3 "Tara Walk" at Freedom Hill and "Stepping Out with the Stars" starring our own Bob Cannon, at Villa Penna \$75 PP. 






SPEAKER PRESENTATION

He then listed the 15 most powerful words that you can use with people.

- 1. I am proud of you
- 2. What do you think?
- 3. Will you please?
- 4. Thank you
- 5. (his or her) name.

He also encourages what he calls a power hour which is one hour every morning that someone should have to themselves. It allows you to clear your mind and organize your day better.

For those who are not comfortable in crowds, he suggests smiling through doorways and walking with a purpose. In meetings, you should want to sit in the power seat at tables. An example of this is the head table at the Rotary meetings. Work on elevator speeches. When people ask him about Rotary, he simply replies that Rotary was the best decision he ever made. By this statement he turned the listener from a shopper to a buyer. They then start asking the questions.

Next he explained the perfect handshake, not the bone crusher or the soft noodle shake that should never be used. The perfect handshake is one where the webbing between the thumb and forefingers on each hand meet and finish in a firm handshake.

Michael concluded the short, but powerful, presentation with some quick tips on growing our club. He said we have a great Facebook page and that everyone should be on Facebook. He brought up the billboard campaign that Rotary spent a lot of money that did very little to boost awareness or membership. He contrasted that with members periodically taking pictures and posting them to their Facebook pages is both free and an extremely effective way of reaching more people.
