#### Speakers from Martha T. Berry Medical Care Facility

ur speakers today were introduced by Jennifer Morgan. Emily Pelyak was up first as she gave the Rotarians some history about Martha T. Berry. Back in the 1870s, it began as a poor farm. Harry Berry was a doctor at the poor farm and a leader in the surgical field. In 1945 upon his death, 19 churches in the area received monetary donations from his estate. In addition, \$273,000 was given to take care of the indigent and poor. Subsequently, Martha T. Berry was built.

Today, Martha T. Berry is a support to low income families as well as others who are impressed with the high quality of care they give to their residents. Many times, the role of Martha T. Berry in Macomb County has been evaluated. In August of 2014, it was approved that Martha T. Berry would be under the auspices of Macomb County and supported by the Macomb County Board of Commissioners. The facility has 217 beds for short- and long-term care. There are in-house doctors and nurses around the clock. The facility features hospice, a beauty salon, physical and occupational therapy, dieticians, an on-site lab, dental and podiatry (Dr. Hosey!) care.

Susan Burkhardt is with the Martha T. Berry Foundation. She shared that Martha T. Berry is the largest Medicaid facility. On September 10 there will be a "No Bake" Bake Sale fundraiser which will honor 65 years of service. The focus is to raise funds for glasses, dentures and hearing aids for the residents who can't afford to replace those that are lost, broken or stolen.

#### TODAY'S SPEAKER: MELISSA GLADIEUX-JACKSON

elissa works as emergency manager for Henry Ford Hospital and she participates in Macomb County's emergency preparedness planning. Melissa explained that several large-scale emergencies

(Hurricane Katrina, Sept. 11, Oklahoma bombing) have



prompted the development of national standards for emergency preparedness. Hospital systems are now linked together under the state DCH and the national Department of

Homeland Security. The role of hospitals in emergencies is being strengthened with the realization that they have a central role. "That is where people go." Her message today was about home preparedness. In Michigan, our highest risks are for water emergencies such as flooding, and also tornadoes.

Everyone should put together emergency kits in their home. Not just one, but one for each family member and pet. Emergency kits should be in waterproof containers and stored in a handy location. Melissa detailed many items that should be included. Start with food and water for three days. Follow the rule of one gallon per person per day. Family members should pack their own kits so they know what's included.

The goal is to be able to weather an emergency event by staying in your home or, to be prepared if you need to leave fast.

#### GUEST SPEAKER – BRAD SCHWARTZ – AUTHOR OF "BROADCAST HYSTERIA"

"Broadcast Hysteria" is the enthralling and never-before-told story of the War of the Worlds radio drama and its true aftermath. On October 30, 1938, families



across the country were gathered around their radios when their regular programing was interrupted by an announcer delivering the news that a meteor had struck in New Jersey.
