
Someone dropped the ball on writing this week's bulletin and didn't get a replacement. Whoever it was should be fined. So I volunteered with alacrity.







SPEAKER: The Honorable Linda Davis, Update on FAN – Families Against Narcotics

his is Judge Davis's second time speaking to us on the pandemic of prescription opiate abuse in **OUT** county. The first time she shared her story of her daughter's addiction to heroin after being prescribed opiates for an injury. Judge Davis went on to create FAN.



Prescription Opiate Abuse has become the number one health crisis the U.S. is facing, according to President Obama. More Americans become unwittingly addicted to opiate drugs, even though legally prescribed, thanks to 90-day prescriptions written by their doctors. Ten years this was recognized as a problem and nothing was done.

FAN is a loose-based coalition that has grown to 19 chapters in Michigan. They have created 25 recommendations they hope will be implemented across the state. Governor Snyder is on aboard. FAN has succeeded in putting NARCAN, an overdose antidote, in police cars in all the communities, except one, in Macomb County. It is very easy to overdose on opiates; one extra pill could do it. Anyone having opiate prescriptions should also have the antidote, available over the counter, at hand. FAN recently presented to dentists on the dangers of writing 30/90 day prescriptions of Vicodin to their patients, many of them children, for pain. The dentists were amazed and agreed to write scrips for three days only. FAN is now working with hospitals to have a peer coach on hand to treat addicts who come into the ER, getting them into treatment programs, not jail. Insurance companies don't know how to treat addiction; they often only pay for four days in rehab. Four days is not enough to cure addiction. There is a new implant that will block opiates and alcohol from getting to the brain. The FDA won't approve it because of the expense involved. A Good Samaritan bill is in the Michigan legislature that will give immunity to people dropping off an overdosing person to a hospital, as opposed to risking arrest. In the Q and A period, it was noted that Walgreens will notify a MD not to write more refills for someone who continually gets refills filled every month.

FAN has to fight the stigma of addiction that it's an inner-city problem only, by saying: Stop judging. Let's work together for solutions.



FAN's annual fundraiser is coming up, Run Drugs Out of Town, on Sunday, July 16, at Fraser High School, a 5K run/walk and 10K run. Follow the link for registration, sponsorships and information:

From the Washington Post, July 6, 2016: "Pfizer, the world's second-largest drug company, has agreed to a written code of the marketing of opioids that some officials hope will set a standard for manufacturers of narcotics and help curb the use of painkillers. Though Pfizer does not sell as many opioids as some competitors, its action sets it apart from companies that have been accused of fueling an epidemic of opioid abuse."



LECTURE

resident Mark introduced Ron Roberts, who is the head of the Chippewa Valley Educational Foundation. Ron started as a teacher in 1978. Later he became a principal and then a director of the school district. He now runs the Chippewa Valley Educational Foundation.

Ron presented a PowerPoint presentation. It showed the district has 850 teachers and over 2,000 employees. Chippewa Valley started in 1994 as a K-8 school. In 1959 it became a school district. In 1965 it graduated its first high school students. Most of the schools in the district have Native American names represented by the Chippewa, Ottowa, and Potawatomi tribes of Michigan - "People of the Three Fires." The district grew from 2,000 students in 1970 to 16,500 students in 2015. It is the seventh largest school district in Michigan. Seventy-four percent of the graduating students enroll in a college in the first semester after high school graduation. Half of each graduating class attains a four-year degree after six years. There are many community outreach programs that have been set up. One of them is the ConnectED Library Challenge. This program encourages all students to have a library card and to know the resources in the local library.

Ninth grade students are given their own special schools within their high school. This is done to develop close relationships within the freshman cohort.

The very best students are allowed to go to the International Academy of Macomb. These students are trained in a special curriculum and their diploma is recognized around the world. Roberts pointed out that the competition is fierce to get into the academy, However, many of the students who don't qualify go on to have excellent academic careers in the regular high school in the district.




