SPEAKER'S PROGRAM





Glenn Burton introduced David Palmer, founder of the Joan Rose Foundation. Mr. Palmer provided us with an update since his last presentation to our club four years ago. His organization's purpose is to improve the lives of vulnerable Haitian children and their families. They currently have 120 children they are serving. While at the foundation the kids receive food, education, clothing, medicine, and support. The foundation's ultimate

goal is to give these children the opportunity to break out of the cycle of poverty. For some, this may involve going to college, and for others it may mean learning a trade. They have started the Good Threads project which allows the parents to earn an income in exchange for making needlework belts. The economic downturn in the Dominican Republic has increased tensions and significant deportation of Haitians from the country. This resulted in the foundation's move to Haiti. For just \$700 a week, 80 kids receive lunch and dinner for six days. More information can be found on the foundation's website (www.joanrosefoundation.com).

Pares. Kris introduced Sheriff Anthony Wickersham who is no stranger to the club. The Sheriff was in town to give us an update as to the success and challenges the force is facing today. The sheriff's department is staffed by 518 employees along Law and Marine enforcement, Jail Correction and Court Service. The county is always recruiting for



good and qualified individuals on many levels. The county has recently installed a 401K plan has a benefit to hire, in a very competitive marketplace. Currently the jail is holding 1,238 "friends of the county" and has been at capacity since 2009. Once the threshold has been met the Sheriff and the court system must decide on which nonviolent offenders are to be released back into society. There has been an upswing in violent crimes being committed with guns due to the drug problem in the county. Opiates of prescription drugs and heroin have been the main cause, resulting in a large number of overdoses and crime. Currently it's a three-minute response time for a 911 call anywhere in the county. The prison chaplain has started "Gateway to Glory" a house used for paroled addicts to transition into society. Sheriff Tony can tell if he is going to have repeat offenders based on a lack of support of a parolee. If family or support group is not present upon discharge there is a high rate that the individual will return to the custody of the county. Since May of 2005 the deputies have saved 31 people from ODs with an inhaled NARLAN substance reviving a person within seconds of use.

He then asked all those that had not been fined to stand and they were fined \$2.












SPEAKER

Sam D'Angelo introduced Dusty Walsh who spoke of Action Activators. Action Activators is a grant funded nonprofit that developed a customized profiling system which matches businesses that are seeking philanthropic endeavors with an aligned nonprofit organization. It gives nonprofits a cost free opportunity to create a profile which includes their list of needs and requests.
