Who We Are









YEARS OF SERVICE

BOARD & LEADERSHIP ROLES

- Challenging each year to fill all roles
- Members take on multiple tasks
- Hard to find replacements when people are ready to try something else
- That's just leadership need additional member support

61% of members needed to fill all roles

ROTARY THIS OR THAT

78% = Grow Friendship / 22% Grow Business Network

11% = Virtual Meetings / 33% = Mix of virtual & in-person / 56% = In-person

40% = Donate \$ / 60% = Donate Time

18% = Morning / 64% = Lunch / 18% = Late afternoon or evening

WHAT THIS TELLS US

- Grappling with membership decline and meeting participation for some time
- We are not alone a common challenge for Rotary in general
- Members join for a variety of reasons and connect with different aspects of our club its not the same for everyone but there is something for everyone
- We need to create a variety of opportunities for members to be involved outside of our traditional weekly meeting format
- We have a strong history and traditions and can build on this to create a club that works for everyone it will just take compromise and creativity
