Program

Joe Goldstein introduced Jay Kearns from the Interfaith Council.

Jay started by informing us that the Interfaith Council is 100% supported by private donations and thanked our club for our annual contribution.

They are the only local organization who gives help to individuals who are in desperate need, they accept calls from churches. They do not give the money directly to the person, instead they pay the provider, such as a fuel company to make a delivery.

Their members are from all religions in the Valley. In addition to emergency funds, they have 3 main activities.

1) Turkey dinners at Thanksgiving

2) Joys of the Season. Voucher program from businesses at \$5 each. A child may get 5 or 6 to spend at establishments around the Valley at Christmas time Schools supply names of the needy families. Some of the businesses don't cash in the vouchers – just donate.

3) Food Shelf. The Interfaith members run the food shelf and need more volunteers. at present operate, 10 – 12 AM, Tues. Thurs. and Sat. and are considering evening hours. This is a \$12,000 annual outlay. They get food from the Food Bank in Barre and distribute 40,000# per year. They average 81 households/month, 25 individuals – just from our Valley. Two biggest months – April and May (end of ski season)

4) Emergency Assistance (described in opening remarks) They keep help anonymous. The Community Fund also helps but not in emergencies.
