One of our newest members, Chris Kirchen received his badge this morning. I believe that all of our members have badges now.

Rotary convention in Montreal.

Daily bus trips are planned from Burlington to Montreal during the convention.

Dave Koepele announced our club had received many thank you notes since our last meeting. A bunch from the kids who received dictionaries and from organizations who received donations: Habitat for Humanity, Good Beginnings of Central Vermont.

Jim Leyton presented Eli Holden with his certificate for his Paul Harris Fellowship (Eli paid the entire \$1,000). Jim said he was so proud of Eli for this achievement and his devotion to Rotary.

At the last BOD meeting the Board approved the following cash grants: Vermont Adaptive Skiing \$1,320 for new attachments for the mono ski; \$100 to the Central Vermont Medical Center; \$698 (added to the previously approved \$302 in September), making the total \$1,000 to the Community Fund; \$500 to the Mad River Chorale( added to our \$ 500 August contribution = \$1,000 for the fiscal year; \$1,000 to the Central Vermont Home Health & Hospice, given to Chuck Martel as their representative.

#### FORUM PRESENTATION & DISCUSSION

Dave K. – "THERE HAS BEEN INTEREST DURING THE PAST SEVERAL MONTHS IN FINDING ANOTHER FUNDRAISER THAT DOES NOT REQUIRE SELLING TICKETS EVERY WEEKEND.

Ken Friedman has taken this on with the help of Jack Simko, Jim Groom and myself. We have had several meetings and even visited the Stowe Rotary Club, who gave us an insight into the workings of their October Fest.

Fear not, the project Ken is going to present to us is nowhere near the effort or expense put into the October Fest. Ken will present the concept and answer questions. Please remember, at this stage we are trying to keep all members up to date, solicit their approval or disapproval, and then carry on from this point".

Ken Friedman - Chilifest Presentation

- 1) Our committee has come up with a new idea for fundraising. In time, we want to get out of the business of selling raffle tickets.
- 2) We came up with various ideas for events based in part on the Octoberfest that Stowe Rotary runs.
- 3) We originally thought about a large event but with the input from Jack Simko, we realized that we need a small test with gradual growth to a significant event.
- 4) Our purpose today is to explain the concept we have developed and take a vote up or down on the concept. We need a fair investment of Rotary funds to execute the plan. This is not a vote that says "Fine, I support it. You go and do it" This is a vote that says "Good idea and I will be happy to work on it."
- 5) Our idea is to run a Chili Contest.
- 6) It would be run initially as part of the July 4th celebration
- 7) Six restaurants in the Valley would be invited to contribute 2 gallons of chili each.
- 8) The public would purchase the chili in 2 oz portions and would vote on the best chili.
- 9) The winner would receive a trophy as would 2nd and 3rd place
- 10) We would make money selling the chili, root beer and hot dogs.
- 11) We might be able to sell beer also, although we are not sure we want to sell beer on our first effort.

- 12) The event would be located in Warren and there are a few possible locations that we are considering. It would go from 11 AM to 3 PM.
- 13) We expect the initial cost to Rotary will be around \$1,500.
- 14) We anticipate making about \$2,500.
- 15) Let me repeat, this is intentionally a small event to test the concept before starting to make it bigger. If it works, then we will consider how we want it to grow.

This presentation was followed by a Q & A period and the members voted to give it a go. There were no opposing votes.
