Doug introduced our 1st speaker for this morning, Michael Wood-Lewis, Co-founder of Front Porch Forum.com or Michael@frintporchforum.com 802-540-0069x3 from Burlington

Michael wanted to communicate with his neighbors, but found they were all too busy going places to stop for a conversation. He couldn't break in. He discovered the neighbors were planning a block party and he had not been invited. He discovered that only 25% of Americans know most of their neighbors.

His solution: Households can connect with neighbors using Front Porch Forum.

He distributed a chart showing Vermont. Areas colored orange showed the regional network of FPF (Waitsfield, Warren, Fayston, and Moretown were part of that group) FPF are currently serving 80 towns and expanding.. It is a great way for neighbors to help neighbors and get acquainted with them.

Our 2nd speaker was Doug Hoffer, who is running for Auditor of Vermont.

He has a BA from Williams College and a JD from SUNY Buffalo School of Law.

He brings to the job: 24 years experience as a policy analyst in Vermont.

5 years under contract to the state auditor, extensive record of work with concrete results, long standing commitment to evidence-based findings; asking tough questions; passion for challenging conventions and accountability.

He promises to work tirelessly to ensure that taxpayer funds are used effectively, the public will see the budget and his office will be accountable, and there will be better use of our resources.
