He started as a teller and worked his way up to branch manager at the Waitsfield branch. As of today he has been promoted to Senior Commercial Lending Representative working out of the Barre Branch.

He started out pursuing a degree in aviation in Allentown,Pa., but when he and his wife decided to return to VT and start a family, he went back to banking. His focus has always been to work with small businesses as he moved thru the ranks of the bank and was given more opportunities to deal with businesses in a variety of capacities.

His newest position is a step towards his goal of being a commercial lender. In addition to his responsibilities as a branch manager in Waitsfield and now as a commercial lending representative in Barre, he will also be a licensed investment associate; selling life insurance, annuities and mutual funds. He anticipates being in this position for 3 - 6 years and then replacing his new manager when the latter retires.
