PROGRAM

Doug introduced Fran Plewak, the president of Mountain Gardeners and active in many other local organizations as well.

Fran said the National Garden Club is the largest organization of its kind with 250,000 members in the U.S.

She emphasized they are not just a bevy of ladies having tea parties.

Fran told us their mission is:

The Mountain Gardeners Club is organized exclusively for charitable, educational and scientific purposes, to stimulate a knowledge and appreciation of horticulture and flower arrangement, aid in the protection of native trees, plants, birds and wildlife, encourage and promote civic plantings and broaden knowledge of conservation.

We have 45 active members, 8 associates, and were founded in 1992. We plant and maintain about 7 gardens (those beautiful triangles at intersections) in the Mad River Valley, give a scholarship each year, do the centerpieces at the senior center, donate flowers to Meals-on-Wheels clients, etc.

They also offer classes in horticulture, collect pennies and create school gardens.

In 1968 they initiated the law banning billboards, in New England they introduced "Smoky Bear" programs for children.

They raise money thru plant sales; pay \$50 annual dues and give out scholarships. They also donated benches by the river and the Big Picture Park.

They have a new brochure explaining what they do.
