Program

Pat Pinkston let the students introduce themselves. They all had their programs on their computers complete with photos.

Sebastian Thorsted was first. He started by showing us a map of Denmark , the smallest and southernmost of the Scandinavian countries. It is separated from Norway by the Skagerrak Strait and from the tip of Sweden by the Kattegat Strait and to the East lies the Baltic Sea. In these waters lie 400 islands. The largest of these islands is Sjaelland, on which is situated the Danish capital, Copenhagen. The harbor contains the famous statue of the Little Mermaid. It is a flat country. It is the oldest monarchy but is a democratic socialist country with a high tax system , that takes care of its people from the cradle to the grave. The price of gas is so high, people drive small cars and most ride bicycles. It is famous for its cuisine - both delicious and delicate in presentation. Danish style furniture is popular all over the world.

Sebastian showed us photos of his house, school and family.

He became a Rotary exchange student to make friends and to connect all over the world thru traveling. He is in contact with Tara Walluck (our exchange student in Denmark).

Marie-Lo Kauffmann, also made a presentation with lots of photos of her country, France which is situated on the west of continental Europe. As everybody knows, Paris is the capital.

Marie showed many beautiful photos of both nature and architecture as well as her house and family. Particularly wedding pictures of her sister and husband - they were married last summer.
