## **Program**

Win is a former executive VP of Merrill Lynch and is the Chairman and CEO of Summit Ventures, LLC. Win purchased Sugarbush Resort in 2001. He is also the author of book coming out "Catching Lightning in a Bottle".

Win - Happy we have snow and cold weather. Lots of people buying tickets and yes, you can keep your pass from last year. It will be updated by computer.

Last year was a great year. 270,000 skier days. Moose running around slopes. Dec. 28th huge crowd (9,600) and they were not prepared for such a big crowd. Next day, 9,400. Usually Martin Luther King day is their best day.

This year they have expanded room in the lodges to handle the large volume.

2,500 people rode the lift from Sugarbush South to North. There will be ample parking this year.

They have added furniture to the Gate House and the Valley House.

He promised to increase the quality of the food. Most people eat at noon and leave around 2 PM.

They have paved the roads around Mt. Ellen so it won't look like a third-world country, painted buildings and improved the aerobic room and locker rooms to reduce complaints from the women. Now using low energy equipment.

They plan to open the mountain from top to bottom by Thanksgiving, 2 additional ticket windows will be opened in the Gatehouse to prevent skiers from having to stand on line outdoors waiting to buy a ticket.

Sales of pre-season tickets are ahead of last year - including all types of passes. Last year 80% bought on day after Thanksgiving.

Had a good Summer in spite of wet weather. Hosted 27 weddings at Sugarbush South. Will add North as a wedding destination this Summer.

Many supervisors and other employees returning this year - makes for great continuity.

Win was certainly delighted over last year's successful operation and brimming with enthusiasm for the coming season.
