Program

It was Gene Scarpato's turn to do his classification speech.

Gene was born in 1931. His mother was expecting a girl and had selected the name Eugenia. He had two older brothers who looked after him until he was ten and then they entered the services and went off to war. Although they both saw heavy fighting, they were extremely lucky and survived unscratched. Gene passed around photos of his family when they were boys. At ages 69 and 71 he lost both of them and still misses them terribly.

He grew up in Queens and went to Catholic School where he had to take a bus and the subway to get to H.S. For a while he joined a XC track team in the Bronx which meant he left home at 6:30 AM and returned at 6:30 PM. That was too much traveling for him and he joined a local track team. They became known as Gene and the 3 Johns - proved to be a winning team. Gene passed around photos of his team. He believes that a picture is worth a thousand words.

After HS he attended St. John's University. After 3 years. He made 2nd lieutenant in California and trained in the mountains. He was on his way to Korea when the peace treaty was signed. Then they sent him to Okinawa to open a camp and plan a mock attack. It turned out to be the same area where his brother had fought during WWII.

During his senior year in HS, he met a 14 yr. old girl and fell in love. When he returned stateside from his Okinawa adventure he married that same girl. They brought home their 1st child from their honeymoon. After their 2nd child was born, they moved to Bayside. Another kid came along and they moved to Lynbrook. They stopped at 5 (3 girls and 2 boys). Gene passed around more photos showing his family. While his children were growing up, he coached basketball, baseball and eventually got into local politics. This led to his becoming mayor. He lost the next election and returned to recreation. Ran again (the new mayor was anti-business) and this time served 12 years. When he retired they put up their house for sale and moved to Vermont.

Lynbrook has 20,000 people and full service commitment, including 60 full time cops. Up here, we have one cop and he caught Gene for speeding.

He hears people complaining about taxes but the taxes here are less than ½ of the taxes in Lynbrook. He paid \$11,000 in taxes for a house with a small lot and here he owns several acres. They had the Waitsfield house for 23 years and used to come here for skiing.

He owned a successful Printing company with his 2 sons for 60 years. A customer offered to lend them money to expand. Unfortunately the customer turned out to be a crook. They closed the business, paid off the debts. Gene got a job with the county for 5 years, earned a pension until he retired and moved to Vermont. It is a completely different life here.
