Larry was thrilled to be reaching his 50th anniversary, Doug going to San Francisco, others happy to be at telephone Co. today, Monk enjoyed seminar on Animal House, many so glad election is over. Lots of other comments that I could not hear, - acoustics were not so good in the garage and Audrey, my helper was absent today.

PROGRAM

Lorraine introduced the technical advisor, Roger Nishi, who came in early this morning to speak to us.

Roger said he loves Rotary for our fund raising and donations which make our community a better place to live. He was happy that Lorraine was president of our club for one term and he loves The Champlain Valley Telephone Co.

He says they only do things that are beneficial long term for the customer. They have spent millions of \$ to improve service - high speed internet innovations did

not stop here when the big companies did not want us. The federal regulators will budget us \$4 million but the cost will be \$44 million.

We should have more than required by the Feds, as we already have what the FEC requires, but need to cover more areas.

The Federal University Fund contributed \$10 million of the local bill. They make up 60% of the funds. Most areas get fiber optics but need Federal Funding for more of the balance of the \$44 million.

Lorraine asked Richard P. to explain about the new e-mail server and system.

The conversion from the old server to a new one was overlong - moved millions of messages - overloaded the system. He had a choice - keep all or junk some of them. He decided to save all. He has an incredible crew but they were in over their heads. Some people were unhappy over the weekend service. The assistance dept. is now using an upstate server for after hours inquiries and have received positive feedback. They will give as much time as necessary to a customer. Of course this may lengthen the time you have to wait to connect to a technician (hold time). The company has gone thru many contingencies during this conversion - e-mail has been flaky but not missing anything.

Customers use e-mail differently - some just for computer messages, others work thru WEB sites, i-phones and other electronic devices. Richard wants to make sure that the data appears the same no matter which gadget you are using.
