Wini - Sal sent me the following notes

On 12/21/11 1:24 PM, "sspinosa@gmavt.net" <sspinosa@gmavt.net> wrote:

Born in Boston; lived in Somerville briefly before moving to Saugus, Mass to live with grandfather on his dairy farm; last working dairy farm in Saugus; now converted to ugly junior high school building. Attended Saugus high; more effort in sports than academics; attended Bates College; more focus on playing collegiate football than academics but graduated 1968, degree in psychology. Next 5 years roamed around a lot; first 2 years in CT working as a child care worker at a residential institution in Deep River, CT; next year enrolled in graduate work at Univ. of Denver in special ed; ran out of money, dropped out and worked construction; next year in Kennebunk, ME working for Lord Construction as brick layer and other assorted roles; moved to Chicago on the request of friend to work in a child care facility; dreadful and left 6 weeks later; return to Kennebunkport, Maine and worked for Kennebunk Chemical, now known as Tom's of Maine; one of his original hires, responsible for sales and other duties as required; sales slow; laid off.

Decided to go to law school and got accepted at small private school in Sacramento; succeeded academically and, despite plans to return to New England, landed good job in office of district attorney in Sacramento; worked there for total of 17 years although I left for one year to work as an assistant U.S. attorney in Sacramento.

Sacramento DA's Office fairly large and divided into sections; worked in following units: misdemeanors, standard felonies, career criminals; adult sexual assault, consumer affairs. environmental, welfare fraud.

Eventually got best job supervising the consumer and environmental protection division where I did all the environmental cases. Trying to return to New England whole time in CA; Took a one year sabbatical and attended Vermont Law School where I obtained an advanced degree in environmental law. Eventually landed a job as director of the enforcement division of the VT agency of natural resources; was director for 15 years; starting my own legal practice with focus on environmental consultation and litigation; having trouble seeing myself retired so the work must go on.

Activities here: been in Waitsfield with wife Debi for 17 years; 10 years on the Waitsfield select board; 10 years in the adult hardball league; enjoy hiking and reading; active in the valley players having been in 10 productions, last of which was "12 angry jurors" which I loved; we keep rescued greyhounds now displaced by the closing of many tracks; gap-to-gap hiker; climbed Katahdin 2 summers ago...extreme climb for an old guy. Debi is former police officer in Sacramento; Two stepsons, 1 a cop in Maine, the other working in an investment firm in Boston; I am first generation USA on my mother's side and second generation USA on father's side; family spread all over New England.
