PROGRAM

WARREN PUBLIC LIBRARY

Gail Hietzker thanked the Rotary Club for inviting her to be the guest speaker. She introduced Deborah Kahn, the Warren librarian, who mentioned that the three Valley libraries (Moretown Memorial, Joslin Memorial and the Warren Public Library) are currently doing some strategic planning together. Hopefully, sometime soon, we will have a "Valley" library system.

Gail mentioned some important 2011 library stats: computer usage is about 23 people per week; over 8,500 people visited the Warren Library this year; and 14.443 items were checked out including books, audio books, movies and magazines. The weekly pre-school Story Hour draws about 17 children each Wednesday and there were 43 library programs/events last year with 1044 participants - this was our first year to go over the 1000-person mark. The Staff includes a full-time Librarian, part-time Children's Librarian, a part-time Volunteer Coordinator/Library Assistant and a part-time PR/Event Director (Gail Hietzker). We have a Board of Trustees, 18 regular circulation desk volunteers and an active Friends of the Warren Library that raise funds to help with library programs and miscellaneous library items.

The library's outreach is very important. To share costs and PR promotions, our programs/events have included the following organizational partners: VT Humanities Council; Joslin and Moretown Memorial Libraries; MRV Rotary Club; MRV Seniors; Rootworks; the Big Picture Cafe and Theater; and the Waitsfield and Warren UCC Churches.

Our ongoing public relations include biweekly columns in The World Newspaper, weekly articles in The Valley Reporter, Facebook, an active library website and various listings on the Waitsfield Telecom Community Calendar. We also send out a

quarterly library newsletter, "The Bookworm", to over 300 Warren Public Library patrons.

The presentation mentioned several upcoming library programs: a February 4th "Take Your Child To The Library Day" (10 AM); a "Button Up VT" Workshop on Monday, February 13th (6:30 PM); a Poetry Slam/Community Potluck at the East Warren Community Market (2nd Floor) on Friday, February 17th (6 PM); and our on-going art exhibits. Gail thanked many valuable library volunteers for helping make the Warren Public Library a viable community organization.
