While I appreciate that you are facing pressure from the people in your community, such a large grant request has to be reviewed on multiple levels. The file has been through its preliminary review, and the program officer is currently in communication regarding the Advanced Site Visitor. PROGRAM

Brian Crandall from N.J. has been in the Valley part time for 15 years.

He loves sports, not just to watch, but to participate and finds the National Senior Games a way to stay active and compete, as the entrants are divided into 5 year age groups. His motto is "If you are doing something, keep doing it".

The organization was formed in St. Louis in 1985 and called the National Senior Olympics and the event drew 2,500 competitors. The US Olympic Committee told the seniors they had to change their name and they became the National Senior Games Association.

Now they hold the event every 2 years and draw 10 to 12 thousand competitors. They are sponsored by Health Organizations.

There are no dues, but people must register to compete. They compete at the state level and the top 4 may go on to the National. This year it will be in Cleveland. There are 19 sports, individual and teams.

Brian started at age 50 in Racquetball, won the tryout at the state level and came in 6th at the Nat'l. Everyone wants to win, but they are friendly and there is a lot of camaraderie.

They used to have winter games, but now just Summer games.

Last time he went there were two competitors over 100 years old. People come from all 50 states and Canada

Editor's note: I competed in bowling at least 6 times. It was easy to qualify in Vermont, but much tougher in the Nationals; best I ever did was 8th, but it was a lot of fun meeting people who were so upbeat. Also entered once in the winter games when the tryouts were held at Sugarbush. I was the only female in my age group and qualified by merely completing the slalom run, making all the gates to the finish line. For that I won the gold medal.
