## PROGRAM

Jim Leyton introduced his friend Gov. Slumlin by saying people want to hear the governor speak, not about the speaker.

The governor thanked Jim for inviting him and said he brought his assistants because the ride was lonely; that he was glad to be in the Valley and he visits often..

He promised that if people voted for him, he would supply the mountains with lots of natural snow. Every time it snows, he reminds Win Smith that he is delivering on his promise.

He finds it tough finding financial resources in the state of VT. He is trying to balance the budget. We are the most progressive state in the union. If revenue is not enough, he will try to bring in more business and create more jobs, especially high tech jobs.

In 2011 we were the only state to see income growth. We are moving on the fast track.

IBM changed from layoffs to requiring more workers, particularly high level positions - engineers for example.

That brings us to the education system. We need improvements to meet the needs of business. All across the state there are 2,000 new jobs requiring more than H.S. level of education to fill these jobs.

Education Funding - We spend more per capita than any other sate yet most kids are not going beyond H.S. We need ed funding beyond H.S. to fill the new high tech positions. He wants funds to give money to kids for one or two years of state college to increase their ability to fill job openings. Another method is for kids to "shadow" experienced workers on the job.

At present we don't connect the dots from education to job level experience. An early start makes a huge difference.

We spent \$17 million- matched to federal funds. We are 2nd in the country indexed to federal standards for education.

Welfare -We have no time limit on welfare. Put a five year limit and give applicants job training. Also don't take away all their benefits at once. As it is, a lowpaying job gives them less money than welfare as they are no longer eligible for benefits. We need a program that will give the poor an incentive to work out of poverty to prosperity.

He has no control over how towns spend the education funds that they receive from the state. He thinks school budgets are too high.

Health Care - The high cost is the biggest obstacle for job growth.

The US spends the most in the world for health care.

There were more questions but he ran out of time.
