Introduction to Marvin Malek by Joe Klimek

Dr. Malek received his medical training in Syracuse, NY and residency at Cook County Hospital. He spent most of his career in community medicine, providing care to under served populations.

He received a grant from the Kellogg Foundation to pursue advanced training in the field of "health policy" at Harvard School of Public Health. He currently practices internal medicine at Central Vermont Hospital. He provides medical consultations and intensive care to hospitalized patients.

Dr. Malek remains active on the issues of health reform, has testified before the legislature and given talks around the state to allow Vermont to lead the nation toward a more humane and affordable health care system.

Dr .Malek proceeded with his computer presentation to promote Health Reform in Vermont - The Case for single-payer universal health care system.

He stated that Health Care affects everyone in two ways:

1) We all have health problems. This causes even more anxiety when financial problems are added. 1/3 of all foreclosures are caused by health costs. Look behind doors and you will see someone has received a bad diagnosis.

Our health care system is taking a large chuck of our money. It is bankrupting the country. The problem is how to provide decent health care without bankrupting the nation.

At present people are afraid leave their jobs and go into business on their own because they would lose their insurance and they can't afford health care on their own. At present 1/4 of the population is either under insured or has no insurance.

44,798 people in the US die annually because they have no access to health care.

In the US life expectancy is lower than any other industrial country.

Seniors are not so bad off because of Medicare.

We spend double what other countries do but they have better life-expectancy rates than we do. In our country procedures cost more and we have a higher procedure volume, higher administrative costs and a higher cost of supplies (inc. drugs)

If you reside in Canada, you have a better chance of living longer.

Whatever benefit we have from all those procedures is often offset by complications caused by these procedures.

In Vermont health care is vague, we spend way more on administration costs and large companies spend about 15% on administration of medical costs- on paper pushing, insurance agencies etc. We pay more for everything such as wheelchairs, drugs, etc. Individual businesses pay 69% on medical and 31% on administrative cost. In the US some seniors are eligible, in other countries everyone is eligible

Since 1970 the growth in doctors is small but the increase in administration costs has skyrocketed. With a single payer system, everyone has comprehensive coverage - all needs are covered.

Here we have both public and private insurance. But with universal coverage, your insurance does not change when you change jobs.

Under Single payer:

Drugs are 50% cheaper; Drastic reduction in administrative costs. Appropriate systems will be designed for hospitals and doctors; there will be a comprehensive data base to detect frauds. There will be planning to match technology with need. Systems can be designed to improve public health. This will save money and create efficiency. All other developed countries have universal health care.

The Dr. ran out of time, so people had to ask questions after the meeting was over.
