## Program

Joe Goldstein introduced Scott McArdle, of the Vermont Community Foundation. Scott is their senior philanthropic adviser. His job is to help people give away money. He lives on the other side of the Adirondacks.

This is Vermont's largest charitable organization. People come to them asking how to give their money away, as much as 16 Million dollars on the large end. It is a

nonprofit organization that works with individuals, families and organizations. They also bring federal funds into our state and help write grants. This is a 140 million dollar foundation.

Last year they gave away over 10 million \$ in grants by writing 2,000 individual checks. 89% goes into Vermont the rest goes to alma maters of the donors.

They are constantly getting new donors. They took in over 11 million \$ last year. They also invest money and made a net return of 28%, thus their money grows.

Some families come to them in need of tax relief from appreciated assets. The donors get to name their trust fund.

They research projects for people who want to donate, especially to local charities, as they have the staff to do the research. One lady wanted to know why aren't more Vermonters going to college? As a result, she set up a fund to give scholarships to deserving HS grads. They manage money by investing it and then send yearly checks to donees, thus they will handle your account long after your death.

They publish a Vermont directory of all the nonprofit charitable organizations in Vermont. They get their information from CPAs and local financial advisers.

Even though they are a 140 million dollar organization they are almost unknown as they are so spread out in the state.

They are almost overwhelmed with requests for grants and spend many hours reading proposals. They look for stability and worthwhile work done by the the organization. They do give feedback to the applicants. First of all the applicant must be a 501.3c nonprofit. They send staff members to consult with the applicants.

Vermont has more nonprofit organizations than any other state, but they are not organized and lack plans. Many people ask for anonymity when making donations.

They offer services for just about everyone who wants to make a difference.
