Al Molnar invited the Turkish GSE team to make their presentation - starting with -

1) OZLEM SECKIN - Team leader, female 24 yrs. old, orthodontist and professor.

She told us she is a member of the Izner Rotary Club and there are 62 Rotary clubs in Turkey. We were astounded to hear their club is 47% female. They were the first club to accept women and were founded in a University.

All of the team members spoke excellent English.

Turkey connects Europe and Asia, is the first locale of civilization. Written language was introduced in their area. The first coins were invented and used and Turkey sired science and literature. In ancient times they were the Byzantine Empire, then became the Ottoman Empire from 1299 - 1923. When the Ottoman Empire lost a war they became a republic and many reforms were introduced.

In April of 1930, the 1st congress in the world for women was created. Turkey has a multi-party parliament. Their motto is "Peace at Home, Peace in the World".

Women wear modern dress and their culture is both ancient and modern. They are a youthful country with 1/3 of the population under 18. Every religion exists there. TURKEY HAS 100% LITERACY!

April 23rd is Children's Day. Only country in the world to honor the children with a day. Oct. 29th is Republic Day with parades etc.

Editor's note: After the leader spoke, I lost track of who said what, but they informed us that:

The Turkish economy is ranked 15th in the world, their agriculture is self-sufficient and industry consists of auto making (they are 6th largest in car production); make 50% of the TV sets, produce textiles, ship building (4th in

the world) and high in construction. Their GNP growth is 8.9%. inflation 6.4%. Unemployment 11.9% but tourism revenue is \$21 billion

Tourism - Turkey is ranked 7th in the world. Attractions are Open Air Museums, they have 2 of the 7 wonders of the world; 1st Basilica of the Virgin Mary, largest Cathedral in the world. Oldest ship wreck - they are a sea faring nation. They have both winter sports and great beaches, and asked us to:

"Meet where the continents meet"

They were obviously well informed, articulate and very proud of their country.

The last 5 minutes consisted of much photo taking of the group with both our cameras and theirs. Club banners were exchanged and a good time was had by all.
